Demonstrations

Last Month's Demonstrator was David Krajec, who presented ways to the lathe for something other than wood turning.

Metal spinning has been around for many years and is considered to be one of the oldest methods of forming sheet metal. There is hieroglyphic evidence that shows the Egyptians knew of metal

spinning and it is believed to have been an art form in China. Paul Revere was a metal spinner. Spinners develop their own technique and it varies by the spinners experience and ability.

July's Demonstrator is Ed Brown, who will be showing us how to turn pens for profit, gifts or just instant gratification. He started making things on the lathe in the mid-1990's. At that time, the pen making industry offered a half dozen "component sets" or "kits". Even though Ed's favorite type of material to turn is resin. Tonight he will talk about even the very small cut off pieces of wood (which most of us can't throw away) have a purpose.
