Monthly Safety Tip

Keep the woodturning tools (roughing-out gouge, round-nose scraper, square-nose scraper, skew chisel, spindle gouge, bowl gouge, parting tool, spiral tool), sharp. A dull chisel requires that you apply excessive feed pressure. Set up the sharpening grinder where you can reach it without moving away from the lathe. Grip the tool being used firmly. Hold the tool's handle in your right hand and support the tool's leading end with your left hand. Prop the tool on the tips of your fingers and grasp the side or top of the blade with your thumb. The index finger should rest comfortably along the ledge of the toolrest. And before you make that last cut remember to always sharpen the tool before that cut. Or even better keep a sharp tool next to you and when you are going to make that last cut pick up that tool and make your cut. You might be surprised how nice that little tool tip can help out. My dad told me that tip and when I remember to do it it's sweet, thanks again DAD. (AKA - Cliff Mitchell)
